

HOA Fees

August 1

Interest Free Period Ends June 30th 2016

Please be advised that the six month interest free period for the Crestmont Homeowners' Association fee ends June 30th. Annual HOA fees are mandatory for all homeowners in Crestmont and are a registered encumbrance on your property title. The HOA invoice is due upon receipt in January and interest begins accruing on overdue accounts as of July 1st each year.

Important Changes to Fee Collection

January Invoices are sent out to homeowners'

and are due upon receipt.

July 1 A letter will be sent out to all

homeowner's with outstanding accounts

to notify them that interest is now accruing and payment is past due.

Outstanding invoices will be sent to our

law firm BD&P for collection.

September 15 A court filing will be made against all

outstanding invoices for recovery of funds, lawyer expenses and interest accrued as set out in the encumbrance

*Please note that all outstanding invoices will be subject to 18% interest per annum under the encumbrance with interest accruing until payment has been collected.

If you have not paid your annual fee yet, please make sure you do so right away to avoid unnecessary interest charges. If for some reason you have not received or cannot find your 2016 invoice, please do not hesitate to contact Shannon Scott, Accounts Manager, at **sscott@qualico.com**.

Please note there has been some revisions to our publishing process therefore, the aesthetics of the newsletter have changed. If you would like to submit an advertisement for the Courier, Suburban Journals will now handle this.

Crestmont Residents Hall Access Card

Due to recent updates to our security system, resident cards will need to be re-activated for lower level access. Every homeowner should have at least one access card, which allows you to enter into the lower level of the Hall to use the facilities. If you have not already, please drop by the Hall during office hours or email your access card number, along with homeowners name and address to *crestmonthall@shaw.ca* in order for us to re-activate your card. If you require further information please feel free to contact the Hall anytime during office hours or email us at the above noted address. Please keep your existing cards to be reactivated.

Waste and Recycling Changes

New bylaw changes will require all businesses and organizations in Calgary to recycle a specific list of materials starting November 1, 2016. The Crestmont Residents' Hall will be required to provide adequate storage and containers for a specific list of materials and there will be fines if we do not comply.

As of February 1, 2016, commercial vehicle loads will have higher fines for loads containing recyclable materials. Waste disposal fees at the Hall have already seen an increase reflecting this change. We are currently investigating waste and recycling options and looking to implement changes prior to the November deadline in order to see a change in our fees.

Council has also approved an Organics Diversion Strategy and the proposed bylaw amendments will be brought to council this Fall.

Changes at the Residents' Hall directly related to the new bylaws will include new waste and recycling containers,

both inside and out. We will also have new waste and recycling bins in our parking lot, which will require a new or additional enclosure. There will be a policy implemented that will require our current and future tenants to follow the new waste and recycling guidelines.

Runner-Up awards went to:


The Gladwyn Family on Cresthaven View, judges were impressed by the hand-crafted displays again this year.
